#### THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN HAS COME NEAR TO YOU

After Lent, Easter and a number of major feast days we return to ordinary time and our reading of St Luke's Gospel. However, today's reading is an appropriate one following on from the feast of Saints Peter and Paul last week. The great apostles preached the Gospel to the people of their time and the Church is founded on the way God was at work through them. Today we here of Jesus sending out seventy-two others to prepare the way before him telling people that "the Kingdom of heaven has come near to you".

This seventy-two are sent out without resources of their own. They are told, "Carry no money bag, not knapsack, no sandals". They are to depend on the people to whom they are sent. In our second reading, St Paul says he only boasts in the cross Christ. As with the seventy-two, he depends on the Gospel he was sent to preach.

The seventy-two come back rejoicing in what has happened through them. Jesus' account of the authority and protection he has given them reminds us of what he says to the disciples at the end of Mark's Gospel, where he similarly gives the authority and tells them that nothing will hurt them. However, this is not the reason they should rejoice, this is simply the power of God at work in them. The reason for them to rejoice is the Good News itself, that the names are written in heaven.

Through our baptism, we too are sent to proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom of God through our lives. Although the Church has to use all sorts of resources in its work, ultimately it is dependent on that Good News and on the power of God at work with it. Jesus invites us to pray that the Lord send labourers to the harvest. We pray that many people, clergy, religious and lay people, may respond to the Lord's call and that we ourselves may take our part in the work of proclaiming the Gospel.


