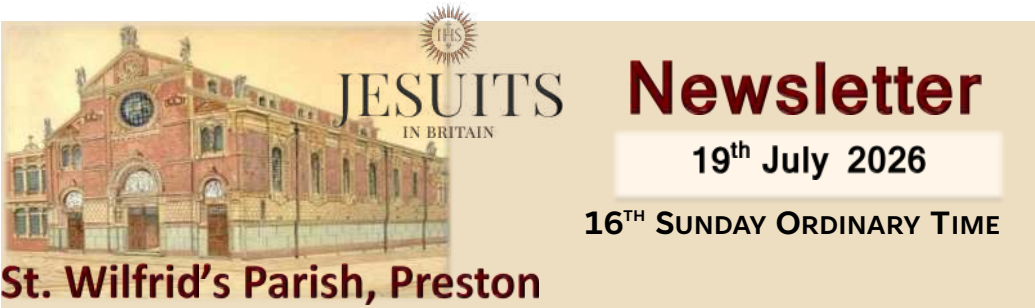

THE WEEDS AND THE WHEAT

Again, this Sunday we have Jesus preaching a parable and then giving an explanation to his disciples. Last week it was the parable of the Sower and this week's parable is also about sowing crops. This time the problem is that someone has come along and sown weed seeds among the good seed the farmer had planted. He tells his men the best thing to do is to let the crops and weeds grow together and separate them out at the harvest. Jesus then applies this to different kinds of people at the end of time.

We can often ask how God allows evil in the world. At the same time, we can often be moved by the good we see, the extraordinary generosity people often exhibit. The world does indeed seem to be filled with wheat and weeds. This is something we come across time and time again in the Old Testament, especially in the Psalms. How is it that wicked people seem to prosper asks the Psalmist. The answer is usually that ultimately good will triumph. God is ultimately on the side of those who are faithful to him.

However, when we come to try and apply this parable to ourselves most of us have a problem. It is not that we fit easily into one category or the other. We are much more like the field. When we look at ourselves we can see good and bad, wheat and weeds. Here it is a bit less clear cut. We do need to work at pulling up some of the weeds in ourselves here and now. However, we have to recognise we are the people we are, with the character we have. We have to accept and work with our weakness, trusting that God will indeed work in us so that we too will "shine like the sun in the kingdom of God".
