VANITY OF VANITIES

Many people struggle to make ends meet. However, even those who most of us would see as very well off often seem never to have enough and to dedicate their lives to acquiring even more. I once heard about a man who had made his money teaching people how to be millionaires. Not how to make the millions, but how to manage the things which went with that lifestyle, for example, where to get your bespoke shirts cleaned (you need a specialist, not just a high street dry cleaner) or how to recruit the crew for your yacht. The man in today's parable is someone with those kind of "problems".

Very few of us are in the billionaire class. However, today's readings can still be a challenge for us. What are the important things in our lives? Do we spend a disproportionate amount of time and effort on things which are, in the end, "vanities"? Do we, perhaps, allow our relationships to be dominated by the kind of resentments felt by the man who asks Jesus to intervene in his dispute with his brother about their inheritance? It does not matter whether we are rich or poor, we still need to ask ourselves the question, "what is at the centre of our lives?" Our example in this is Christ himself, who made himself poor, even to death on the cross, that we might

have the abundance of life which God wants to give us. So often in scripture the image of abundance, of the great feast, is used to illustrate the love of God. We see in the Gospel, at the marriage feast of Cana, the miraculous draft of fish for the feeding of the five thousand. As we hear today's readings let us ask that we may focus on the true riches that come from God and respond in love to his generosity.
