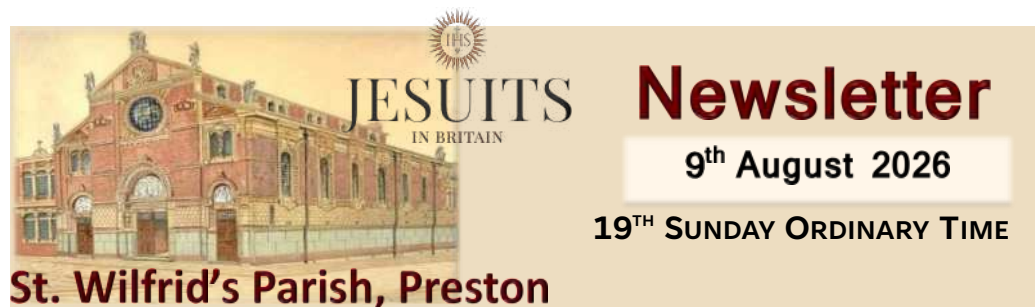

PAUL'S (AND JESUS') BROTHERS AND SISTERS

In the second reading today, St Paul talks about his great desire that the Jewish people come to accept Christ. They are his people, they are the people of the early church, they are the people of Jesus. We recognise that the origins of Christianity are rooted in Judaism. Much of our understanding of God's relationship with his people and our own practice comes from those Jewish roots. We share the Word of God expressed in the Old Testament.

The history of the relationship between the Christian Church and the Jewish people has often been marked by hatred and violence. We have cause to acknowledge the pogroms and persecution over the centuries which ultimately paved the way for the Holocaust. Antisemitism was still around in the language when I was growing up and it has not gone away.

The second Vatican Council produced a historic document on relations with non-Christian religions, *Nostra aetate*. This includes a section on relations with the Jews, acknowledging their special place and quoting the passage from St Paul which is our second reading. This document led to a flowering of dialogue and cooperation between Christians and Jews.

This relationship is challenged today. There is a resurgence of antisemitism. In part this arises from the conflict between the state of Israel and the Palestinians. Atrocities have been committed on both sides. We are particularly aware of the suffering of Palestinian Christians and have supported them through contributions to the Jerusalem Patriarchate and charities such as Aid to the Church in need. Avoiding antisemitism does not mean condoning violence.

Above all, we need to remember the words of the Second Vatican Council, "*The Church reproves, as foreign to the mind of Christ, any discrimination against people or any harassment of them on the basis of their race, colour, condition of life or religion*".
