1ST SUNDAY IN ADVENT

ADVENT



Today we begin a new Church year with the season of Advent. We use this time to prepare to celebrate the coming of Christ. Obviously we think primarily of the coming of Christ in to our world at Christmas. God coming to share our lives,

God-with-us, Emmanuel. However, our prayers and readings also remind us of the need to be prepared for the coming of Christ at the end of time and the need to live our lives here and now in the light of Christ's becoming one of us.

In some places the trappings of Christmas have already been up for the last couple of weeks. We already hear Christmas carols played in the shops and see Christmas decorations all round us. Once Christmas has come many of these signs of Christmas will disappear. On Boxing Day, the day after Christmas, the focus shifts to the sales. However, for us this is a time of preparation. Gradually indications of the coming feast will appear in the church but the key moment will be the celebration of the First Mass of Christmas. From then our church will reflect the arrival of Christ as the babe of Bethlehem. While for most people this will end at the feast of the Epiphany, for us the remembrance of Christmas only ends with the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple on 2nd February. So if people ask you why we still have our Christmas decorations until then you can explain to them.

For us the time until Christmas is indeed a time of preparation. It is not simply about writing cards and wrapping presents. Above all it is a time to prepare ourselves to receive Christ. A time to reflect on ourselves, the changes we need to make in our lives and to hear John the Baptist's message of repentance. Chris Pedley, S.J.
