PEOPLE FROM EAST AND WEST

In today's Gospel Jesus is travelling towards Jerusalem and the Cross. He is travelling through towns and villages where he is teaching. He is a celebrity and people are drawn to him. However, they do not necessarily take his message seriously. He is calling on them to change and yet his presence seems to be producing a kind of complacency. Jesus' message is a call to action. We have to "strive to enter by the narrow door" by living out the Gospel message Jesus brings.

Jesus makes clear that he has not just come for a limited group of people. He is not just there for the people he meets, or for his Jewish compatriots. The picture of the kingdom of God, the heavenly banquet, in the Old Testament, depicts people from east and west coming to join



in. This inclusivity is picked up by Jesus in what he tells his hearers. It was also a practical reality for the early Church. We read in the Acts of the Apostles the story of how the early Christians came to realise that the Gospel was for everybody, gentiles



as well as Jews. If we look at the Church today we see that it really is a universal Church. It is not simply associated with a European based "Christian" culture. Most people in the Church today are not from Europe or North America and this has implications for the way the Church operates.

As we listen to today's Gospel we ask that we really follow Jesus, that our complacency might be challenged. We also ask that we may recognise our brothers and sisters from around the world with whom we are called to share in the heavenly banquet.

GLOBAL CHURCH PETITION FOR THE GLOBAL DEBT CRISIS
