EVERYONE WHO HUMBLES HIMSELF WILL BE EXALTED

This week we had the funeral of Patrick Rooney. Patrick was someone who was outstanding in his care for those who were in need, especially the homeless. One of the things in which he was involved was our drop in meal on a Tuesday evening. The second part of today's Gospel is particularly appropriate as we remember Patrick. He was someone who cared for those who could not repay him.

St Ignatius of Loyola, in the Spiritual Exercises, describes the process through which the spirit of evil works as, "riches, honour, pride". One leads on to the other. He contrasts this with Jesus, poor, rejected and humble. This is the Jesus of the cross. The person doing the Spiritual Exercises asks to follow the way of Jesus. This is the way Jesus suggests that the Pharisees need to follow rather than seek the kind of honour that reflects pride not humility. What does this mean for us? There is a difference between the humility which comes from the evil one and a failure to acknowledge the gifts we have received from God or a



holding back which does not use those gifts in the service of others. However, today's Gospel does challenge us to look at ourselves and our values. In various places we see riches, honour and pride at work in public life and extolled as if they were the purpose of Jesus points out the vanity of these things. We are called to follow the way of Jesus. Called to serve others and not to look for a reward.

We give thanks for the example of people like Patrick and others, such as those who continue, through the Metanoia Project, to provide our Tuesday and Wednesday service to the poor. We ask that we too may follow the example of Christ in unselfish service.

World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

The World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation is an annual event observed by the Church on 1st September, initiated by Pope Francis in 2015. It serves as the starting point of the Season of Creation, a monthlong period of prayer and action for environmental protection, concluding on the feast of St. Francis of Assisi on 4th October. This day encourages us, as Catholics, to reflect on our role as stewards of creation and to renew our commitment to caring for the environment. The day is inspired by Pope Francis's encyclical Laudato Si', which calls for all people to care for our shared Earth. Pope Francis also introduced a specific Mass, Missa pro custodia creation, for use on this day and during the Season of Creation.

For 2025 the theme is "Peace with Creation" and uses the symbol of the "Garden of Peace". The "Garden of Peace" symbol features a dove carrying an olive branch, drawing inspiration from the biblical story of Noah's dove, which signified the end of the flood and the beginning of a new peace. This year's theme emphasizes the interconnectedness between



caring for creation and fostering peace, highlighting the need for ecological healing and justice.

ACCOMPANYING HOPE "We need to be capable of being a people who stand at the side of others, listening to them, becoming a Church that accompanies all people," Pope Francis. In response to the Synod and in preparation for the Jesuit Parishes Conference in November we will be holding a series of sessions, open to everyone of the Parish, after the 10.15pm Mass on
