TAKING UP THE CROSS



No sooner has Jesus said to Peter, "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church" that he is saying, "Get behind me Satan. You are a hindrance to me". Peter is unable to accept Jesus' prediction of the Passion. Peter has said Jesus the Christ but his idea of what this means does not include Jesus' death and resurrection.

Jesus not only predicts his own Passion but goes on to say that his disciples must follow the same way, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me". For once, our second reading has a similar theme. Paul tells those to whom he is writing that they should present their bodies as a living sacrifice and not "be conformed to his world".

For Peter following Christ would literally mean martyrdom on a cross. However, it can be more difficult to see what this means for us. The cross is a sign of total generosity. Christianity is not a part time religion nor one where we can put limits on how far we are prepared to follow Christ. This can mean accepting whatever God brings us in our life and seeing in our own suffering a way of sharing in that self-giving of Christ. Simon Bishop, a Jesuit who died of cancer last year, was able to do this. When he first visited the hospice he wrote, "What a gift! Who would have thought that God would ask this of me? What a privilege – to offer this up with the Lord for His needs and intentions and those of the Church and the world". We may not all be as close to Christ as Simon, but we might pray for the ability to take up Christ's call to follow him.
