ANYONE WHO DOES NOT RENOUNCE ALL THAT HE HAS CANNOT BE MY DISCIPLE

In the Gospel in recent weeks we have been hearing Jesus talking about the demands of being his disciple. This week we have that message expressed in very strong language: "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother...and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple."

does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple". Yes, this is strong language. It does not necessarily mean we are called to be martyrs, turn our back on our family relationships or give up all the gifts we have received. However, the Gospel does challenge us to look at the foundation of our lives and call us to judge what really matters. If we really believe in Christ, and want to follow Christ, we have to put that first in our lives before everything else, including life itself.

In last week's newsletter I mentioned the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius of Loyola. He takes the perspective of today's Gospel as his starting point. Everything we are and have is God's gift to us to enable us to love and serve him. The Exercises are aimed at helping us see what that actually means in our lives, what it is that we are called to do. He ends the Exercises with a prayer which we might make in response to today's Gospel:-

Take Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will, all that I have and possess. Thou hast given all to me. To Thee, O Lord, I return it. All is Thine, dispose of it wholly according to Thy will. Give me Thy love and Thy grace, for this is sufficient for me.
