EXALTATION OF THE CROSS



This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. As you come into our church it is dominated by the figure of Christ on the Cross. This is the core of our faith, that Christ died for us on the cross so that we might have life through him.

Our litural picks up two scenes from the Old Testament. The Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer looks back to the story of the Fall in the book of Genesis. Praising the Father, it says, "For

you placed the salvation of the human race on the wood of the Cross, so that, where death arose, life might again spring forth and the evil one, who conquered on a tree, might likewise on a tree be conquered through Christ our Lord.

The second scene is that of Moses in the desert, when the Lord has sent serpents among them, raising up the bronze serpent as a sign of healing. This is the scene Jesus picks up in the Gospel, speaking to Nicodemus. He sees this as a symbol of his own Cross, raised up for our healing.

Today's feast celebrates the Cross, which would otherwise be a symbol of horror and death, as a symbol of life and healing. Today we celebrate, as Jesus says in the Gospel, that "God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world but in order that the world might be saved through him".

Whenever we come into the church let us take a moment to notice the Cross and to understand its significance for us. Similarly, when ever we see the image of the Cross, whether in our homes or in so many places around us, let us remember it as a sign of life, as sign of what God has done for us.
