The First Shall Be Last by James Tissot

IT ISN'T FAIR

The parable of the labourers in the vineyard in today's Gospel is a challenging one. Our immediate sympathies are likely to be with those who worked in the heat for twelve hours. In the immediate context the message, "the last will be first and the first last" is the familiar one that the Gospel is for the gentiles, the poor, the tax collectors but will be rejected by the

obvious people, the scribes and the pharisees. However, it is worth asking ourselves what this overturning of expected values might mean for us.

One message is that we do not earn our way into heaven. God's love and mercy is there for everyone. It is not dependent on our piety or good works. It is there for those who recognise their need of God. That is the kind of compassion that our first reading from Isaiah talks about. It reminds us of the parable of the Prodigal Son in Luke's Gospel and we can resent God's generosity just like the elder son in that parable.

The parable can also be a challenge to our ordinary way of thinking. The labourers who started first thing in the morning are comparing themselves to others and making judgements about what they deserve. They are disgruntled because they are not getting what they think is their due. That is something most of us can probably recognise in ourselves. Are we resentful or do we give thanks to God for his generosity to others?

We might also think about the story from the point of view of the ones who come at the eleventh hour. They have been idle and have missed out because no one has hired them, not because they are lazy. They and their families are in just as much need of the denarius as the others. In that way too the parable gives us a different perspective on life.
