2ND SUNDAY IN ADVENT

PREPARE THE WAY FOR THE LORD



Throughout the coming year we will be hearing the Gospel of Mark at Mass on Sunday. Today we have the beginning of his Gospel. Unlike Matthew or Luke we get no account of the infancy of Jesus, no stable, no shepherds, no wise men. Instead, we begin with the appearance of John the Baptist.

John is the one who fulfils the prophecy of Isaiah in our first reading. He is the joyful messenger who prepares people for the coming of Jesus and points him out when he comes, who says, "Here is your God". In John's Gospel, John the Baptist says to the first disciples, "Behold the Lamb of God", when he sees Jesus and those disciples leave John and go off and follow Jesus. Those words of John the Baptist are words which are used at every Mass when the priest holds up the Blessed Sacrament before Communion.



John's message is a message of repentance, a call to change. Again, as we celebrate Advent, we are called to reflect on what we need to do to prepare the way for the Lord. How do we need to change our hearts and our lives to live the Gospel more closely? What is there that needs God's

forgiveness that we need to acknowledge? How do we need to work in our world to share in the mission of John the Baptist and prepare the way for the Kingdom of God?

THE POPE'S MESSAGE TO WORLD LEADERS AT COP28



Sadly, due to ill-health, Pope Francis was unable to go to Dubai but here are some quotes from his hard hitting message.

"the destruction of the environment is an **offence against God,** a sin that is not only personal but also structural, one that **greatly endangers all human beings**, especially the most vulnerable in our midst and threatens to unleash a conflict

between generations." Climate Change is "a global social issue and one intimately related to the dignity of human life".

He asked the question "Are we working for a culture of life or a culture of death?"

I make this heartfelt appeal: **Let us choose life!** Let us choose the future! May we be attentive to the cry of the earth, may we hear the plea of the poor, may we be sensitive to **the hopes of the young and the dreams of children!** We have a grave responsibility: to ensure that they not be denied their future."

"The drive to produce and possess has become an obsession, resulting in **an inordinate greed** that has made the environment the object of unbridled exploitation."
