DO WE UNDERSTAND?

One of the purposes of Lent is to give us time and space to reflect a little bit more than usual on the place of God and his Son Jesus in our lives. If our faith in them and our love for them is to grow it needs to be nourished and cultivated, otherwise it runs the risk of withering and dying. So what can we do to help it flourish?

One good way, particularly in this season, is to spend time reflecting on the Passion of Jesus. We can do this in our own personal prayer or on things like the stations of the cross. Yet we can still find it very difficult to understand why all this had to happen to Jesus. Could Jesus not have done the work of our redemption by living to a fine old age and dying peacefully in his bed? Perhaps he could, but would there not have been something missing? Look at the harsh life or cruel death that many people throughout history have had to endure. Would Jesus be any encouragement or consolation to them if he had escaped such circumstances? Would it not indicate that Jesus was willing to go so far but not any further for us? Whereas the truth is that there is nothing he was not willing to do for us, no lengths to which he was not willing to go for our salvation. And all because of his love for us.

If we still find this hard to comprehend what about the apostles? Saint Mark tells us that Jesus predicted his Passion three times and each time was met with incomprehension. First, Peter told him that this must not happen. Second, they were arguing about which of them was the greatest. Third, James and John asked to be given the greatest seats in the Kingdom. Maybe with God's grace we're doing a little better than they were.



We will have some of our stock in the narthex next Sunday 3rd March




Sign up for the Jesuit Missions' Lenten Campaign, *Mission to Hope*

This year, every Monday during Lent the Vatican will publish a vignette drawn by Maupal illustrating a passage from the Pope's Lenten message. The artist is known to Romans (and the world) for his portraits of Francis painted on the streets of the Eternal City.

By commissioning the artist the aim was to "break away from a classical presentation" and invite Christians to broaden their horizons, explains Muriel Fleury, head of communications in the Vatican.

An artist's eye allows us to "see things we wouldn't necessarily have seen,

The first poster, designed around the general theme of the message — "Through the desert God guides us to freedom" —

depicts Francis carrying a cart laden with a bag labelled "faith," tracing a path through a desert littered with nails. These nails, Maupal explained at a press conference, represent "our old and new idols, all our prisons. "When we follow Pope Francis, who opens the way with the strength of faith, they disappear: The road becomes passable for all," he added.
