AS THE FATHER SENT ME SO I AM SENDING YOU

When we hear today's Gospel from John about Jesus appearance to his disciples we tend to focus on the story of Thomas. However, something very significant happens during the first appearance.




The disciples are gathered together, and the door of the room is closed because they are frightened that what happened to Jesus in his passion will happen to them. These are the ones who ran away when Jesus was arrested. Now Jesus comes to them and says, "Peace be with you". He shows them his hands and his side, just as he will to Thomas the following week. He proves that he is the one who is crucified and that he is alive. He then

says something extraordinary, "As the Father sent me so I am sending you". These disciples who have shut themselves in out of fear, who abandoned him when things got difficult, these are the ones who are sent out to carry on Jesus' mission. He then gives them the gift they need to do what he has told them, the gift of the Holy Spirit. These very disciples are beginning of the Church. Furthermore, they are given the power to forgive sins.

Elsewhere in the Gospels it is Jesus' claim to forgive sins which brings him into conflict with the scribes and pharisees. They point out that only God has the power to forgive sins. The resurrection demonstrates who Jesus is, the one who does have the power to forgive sins. His death and resurrection are the very things that bring the forgiveness of our sins. Now, through the Holy Spirit, Jesus gives that power to his Church. It is this working of the Holy Spirit which the Church relies on in the sacrament of Reconciliation.

We are all, through our baptism, sent by Christ as he was sent by his Father. We are sent to proclaim the good news of God's mercy, the good news of Easter to our world. As we hear today's Gospel let us ask for the gift of the Holy Spirit to carry out the mission we have been given.


