3RD SUNDAY IN ADVENT

REJOICE IN THE LORD ALWAYS



Today is known as "Gaudete Sunday" from the Latin version of the opening antiphon which says, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near", quoting St. Paul writing to the Philippians. It provides a little bit of relief in the penitential season of

Advent and we mark it by using rose coloured vestments at Mass.

Our first and second readings today pick up that theme. In the passage from Isaiah, the one Jesus applies to himself when he preaches at Nazareth, He says he has been sent "to bring good news to the poor". St. Paul, writing to the Thessalonians, says, "Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God".



It can be easy to lose sight of what Pope Francis calls, "The joy of the Gospel". In this season, when the days are short and often wet and gloomy, it can reinforce a sense of despondency. Perhaps that comes from an awareness of our own weakness and sinfulness. awareness of negative things in our lives. Perhaps it can come from looking at our world torn by war and injustice. However, this season points towards the reality of The good news is that God Christmas. has come to us, as one of us. The child of Bethlehem is our sign of hope and Joy, the sign above of God's love for us, his giving of his very self. This gives a fresh

perspective to all the things in our lives and in our world. In the light of Christ we can indeed, "give thanks for all things" and be filled with joy at God's presence with us.
