WE ARE WITNESSES TO THIS

Many of the episodes in the gospels with which we are most familiar actually appear only in the gospel of Saint Luke: the Annunciation, the



shepherds at the manger, the boy Jesus in the temple, the good Samaritan, the prodigal son, the rich man and Lazarus, the pharisee and the publican, Zacchaeus in his tree, the good thief, the walk to Emmaus, the immediate sequence of which we hear in this Sunday's gospel, and others. Luke also wrote a second volume, the Acts of the Apostles, which we read all during the Easter season.

All four gospels have their own characteristics. Luke seems to specialize in a supremely artistic presentation of the activity and parables of Jesus. His emphasis is on the gospel being good news for the poor, the downtrodden, the sinful, not because such people are necessarily any better than anyone else but because God shows them greater mercy and compassion, knowing that they need it. Jesus shows them a tenderness and love which they have often never experienced before. Dante called Saint Luke the *scriba mansuetudinis Christi*, the one who most clearly depicted the gentleness and loving kindness of Christ. Surely we too know our need of such a welcoming and healing presence in our lives. And the more we realise our own need, the more we are invited by Christ to recognize such needs in our fellow men and women. The greater our consciousness of the forgiveness we have been offered, the more we must extend such forgiveness to others.

At the end of our gospel today Jesus reminds us that this good news would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. "You are witnesses to this."
