3rd SUNDAY OF LENT

JESUS IN THE TEMPLE



Today's Gospel shows a different Jesus to the one we expect. Here Jesus responds angrily to the abuse he sees in the Temple or the substitution of reliance on the Temple for obedience to God, obedience to the Law we get in our first reading. The Temple of Jesus time was the one which King Herod had built. It was new, in fact

work was still going on. Jesus' hearers point out that it had already

taken forty-six years to build. Jesus, however, uses the Temple as sign of his own passion and resurrection.

In last week's scene of the Transfiguration we saw Jesus glorified in the presence of Moses and Elijah as the fulfilment of the Law and the Prophets. Today Jesus talks about the Temple which is his body. He is the



fulfilment of all that the Temple stood for. He is the mediator between us and the Father. He is the one who brings and offering far greater than anything offered in the Temple sacrifices, his own self, given for us on the Cross. The Letter to the Hebrews portrays Christ as the high priest who passes through the curtain into the real Holy of Holies in heaven bringing an eternal offering. The Mass enables us to participate in this offering as we remember the death and the resurrection of Jesus.

The Temple in Jerusalem would be destroyed by the Romans a few short years after the time of Jesus. Only the "Wailing Wall" remains. The Temple of Christ's body remains for ever. Our Gospel reminds us of this as we prepare to celebrate the central events of our faith in Holy Week and Easter.

The next week of Lent, shows the pope is staging something of a prison break. Stretching through the barbed wire, Pope Francis reaches down the high cement prison walls to pull a man and woman out of captivity. Each prisoner is wearing a ball and chain bearing the words "fear" and "hate," but these shackles seem to have already been removed at the guidance of the Pope.

The new artwork points toward a passage of Pope Francis' Lenten message, in which he reminds us that the "love of God and love of neighbour are one love." The Pope invites the faithful "to pause in the presence of God beside the flesh of our neighbour."

Furthermore, the image could be considered to represent another passage of the message, where the Pope invited "every Christian community to do just this: to offer its members moments set aside to rethink their lifestyles" to evaluate and improve their contribution to society. The prisoners, who have rethought their lifestyles, are now prepared to be pulled out of the prison that sin creates for each of us.
