CHRISTIAN UNITY WEEK



This week is Christian Unity Week. My apologies for not alerting you to this last week. Each year a Christian community from around the world provides material for reflection for this week. This year the material comes from Burkina Faso in Northern Africa. This is a community which has experienced a great deal of violence and insecurity. The passage they have chosen for our reflection is the parable of the Good Samaritan. The Churches Together in Britain and Ireland website says, "The parable of the Good Samaritan is one of the best known passages of Scripture, yet one that never seems to lose its power

to challenge indifference to suffering and to inspire solidarity. It is a story about crossing boundaries that calls our attention to the bonds that unite the whole human family.

In choosing this passage of Scripture for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, the churches of Burkina Faso have invited us to join with them in a process of self-reflection as they consider what it means to love our neighbour in the midst of a security crisis. Communities in the British-Irish context may be less vulnerable to acts of mass violence than in Burkina Faso, but there are still many living with the memory and/or the threat of serious violence, centred on issues of identity and belonging. There are also groups within communities, including people from ethnic minority backgrounds and people seeking asylum, who feel particularly vulnerable to violence or being displaced by the threat of violence".

We are praying prayers from this material during Mass each day and we might like to reflect on Luke 10:25-37, seeing what it might say to us about our own call to love God and to love our neighbour as ourselves. This may be in our relations with other Christians and with those of other cultural backgrounds, or it may be about how we can work with our brothers and sisters to respond to those in need. See

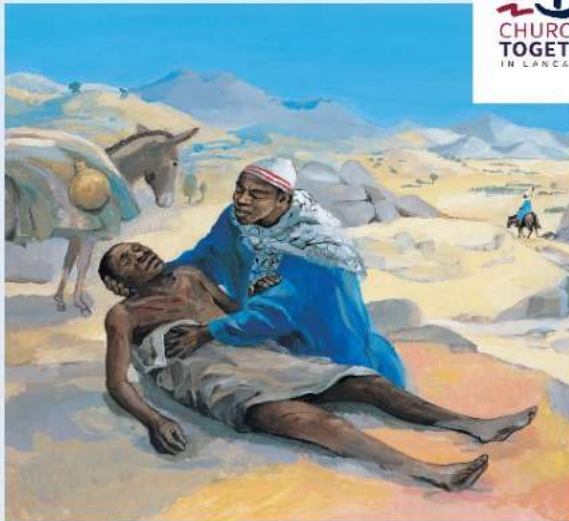
