### NOW THE HOUR HAS COME FOR THE SON OF MAN TO BE GLORIFIED

The Jewish people of Jesus' time lived in the middle of a Greek culture. The New Testament itself was written in Greek. Today some Greeks ask to see Jesus. They represent the whole of humanity whom Jesus has come to save. The passage ends by Jesus saying that when he is lifted up on the Cross he will draw all men to himself.



This contrasts with what John calls "the Jews", which does not mean the Jewish people, but rather those who reject Jesus. The appearance of those for whom he has come leads Jesus to spell out what is about to happen.

Jesus says, "Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified".



He goes on to use the image of the grain of wheat falling into the ground and dying so that it can produce a rich harvest. Jesus is glorified in his Passion. Both the Gospel and the Letter to the Hebrews talk about Jesus' recognition of

what this is going to cost him. However, Jesus obediently lays down his life so that we might have eternal salvation.

We are also called to follow Jesus' model of obedience. We are called to be Jesus' servants and to follow his way. This includes accepting that, "Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life". Lent reminds us to let go of all those things that keep us from God and to give of ourselves in the service of others. This Sunday we mark the closeness of our remembering the Passion of Christ by veiling the statues in church. As we prepare to remember the events of Holy Week we ask that we might follow the pattern of Christ in our lives.




If you would like to have your feet washed on Maundy Thursday there is a list in the Sacristy.
