THAT IS WHY I CAME



There is a great busyness and todav's in Gospel. energy Jesus starts the day in the synagogue, goes to Peter's house and cures his mother-in -law. Then, in the evening, the house is surrounded by the whole town bringing people to be cured. It must have been very late when they eventually went away but Jesus is up before dawn to pray. When Peter and the others find him and tell him the crowds are

back again, Jesus tells them that they need to move on to the other towns so he can preach there too. He says to them, "that is why I came".

That sense of purpose, which Jesus shows, is a complete contrast to our first reading which begins, "Is not man's life on earth nothing more than pressed service". It can be easy for us to lose sight of the purpose in our lives, or we can feel overwhelmed by the demands that life makes. Perhaps that becomes more so as we get older.

Today's Gospel challenges us to reflect on the purpose of our lives, especially the task given to us in our baptism. We are called to share with the Church in Christ's mission. We are called to share in Jesus' mission to proclaim the Good News and bring healing and comfort to those in need. We might ask for the Holy Spirit to give us something of that energy we see in Jesus. For this to happen we need to take notice of the other thing which we see Jesus doing, which is spending time with his Father in prayer. Prayer and action go together, one feeds into the other. So let us pray for that sense of purpose in our lives so that we might live out the call of our baptism. Chris Pedley, S.J.

Thursday 8th February is the Feast of St. Josephine Bakhita c. 1869 – 1947



Josephine Bakhita is a Sudanese Saint, kidnapped aged 9 and sold into slavery. She suffered terribly at the hands of her kidnappers who gave her the name *Bakhita* meaning *Fortunate*. Age 35 she was bought by the Italian Consul and, eventually, came under the care of Canossian Sisters in Venice. She became a Catholic in 1890 and joined that order in 1896 as a Sister. Her life then was of simplicity, prayer and service. She suffered haunting memories of her torture whilst in slavery. She died 1947 and was canonised October 2000.

Human trafficking now is the second most profitable worldwide criminal enterprise, after the illegal arms trade.
