## PRAYING FOR THE SICK

In today's Gospel we see Jesus compassion towards the sick. When the leper says to Jesus, "If you want you can cure me", Jesus says, "Of course I do! Be cured!". Healing the sick is one of the things Jesus sends his disciples out to do in the Gospel. This Sunday is the World Day of Prayer for the Sick and also for the unemployed. For many people in this country those two things go together.



Praying for the sick probably something we all do on a regular basis. We usually include the sick in our Prayers of the Faithful at Mass. The Church has a special sacrament of Anointing the Sick. This used to be thought of as something only for those in immediate danger of death, but it is intended for any who are seriously ill, and it is better if it can be celebrated when the person concerned is able to play a full part.

We can sometimes question God's goodness when we or those close to experience sickness. This is especially true if sickness involves considerable pain or is prolonged. However, sickness and suffering are part of what it is to be human. God does not promise that our lives here will be free of suffering and what transforms that reality is that Christ has come and shared in that reality. The miracles in the Gospel are signs that Christ, through his death and resurrection, overcomes suffering and death. As Christians we are called to have a different understanding of suffering which enables us to unite ourselves with the suffering of Christ. This does not mean that we should not pray to God for the sick and for ourselves, but it does give us a different perspective, one based in hope and trust in God's compassion.

Unfortunately due to staff shortages the shop will be closed on Friday 2nd February.

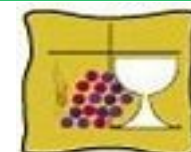
