#### HE IS RISEN

In neither of the Gospels we hear today, whether Mark's account at the Easter Vigil or John's account during the day on Sunday, do we encounter the risen Jesus, but the message is quite clear, the tomb is empty and Jesus




is risen.

In Mark, Mary of Magdala and the other women to the tomb to anoint Jesus' body but discover the stone has been rolled away. The body of Jesus is not there but there is an angel who gives them the news that Jesus is risen and that they are to go and tell the disciples. In the passage from John, we have the disciples' response to Mary of Magdala's message. Peter and the beloved disciple, usually identified as John, go and look for themselves. They find the empty tomb. Peter goes right inside followed by John. However, John sees something

more than just the empty tomb and the cloths. He sees and he believes. He understands the scripture has been fulfilled, Jesus has indeed risen from the dead.

It is perhaps appropriate that our Easter Gospels do not include an appearance of Jesus. We like the women and like John we have to understand the message of the empty tomb and respond with faith. We are called to see and believe. We are called to believe, not just that Jesus' body is no longer in the tomb or even that he is alive. We are called to believe in the significance of Jesus resurrection. This is not simply someone coming from the dead like Lazarus. Christ's resurrection transforms everything. In the words of the Easter Proclamation sung to the Father, "Christ your Son, who, coming back from death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity and lives and reigns for ever and ever." We are called to see our world in that light of Christ, that light of the resurrection. We are called to see that creation has been transformed and that we have the hope of sharing that eternal life with the risen Christ.

All our profits go to charities.


We will close for Easter and reopen on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> & Monday 8<sup>th</sup> Thanks to everyone who has supported the shop.
