PALM SUNDAY



At today's Mass we hear two contrasting Gospels. In the solemn version of the Mass we begin with the Gospel of Christ's entry into Jerusalem. The people are singing "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord", and spreading clothes or branches under the feet of the colt Jesus is riding. It is a scene of which we are reminded at every Mass when we say the Holy, Holy or Sanctus before after the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer.

This scene of triumph is very different from the Gospel we hear at the usual point in today's Mass. Here we

have the account of the Last Supper and of Jesus Passion. This again echoes what happens at Mass. We move from the Hosannas of the

Sanctus to the representation of the Last Supper and the sacrifice of Christ. Christ gives himself for us in the form of bread and wine and on the Cross. It is in the moment of Jesus death that the veil of the Temple, which separated the Holy of Holies from the rest of the Temple, is torn in two. The separation of God and human beings is ended. Throughout



Mark's Gospel there has been the question who Jesus is. It is in this moment that the Centurion recognises that, "in truth this man was a son of God". We end with the women waiting at the tomb.

Today's celebration begins Holy Week introduces us to the things we will be celebrating. As we listen to the Gospels today let us ask for a deeper understanding of all that Christ has done for us.

Sadly Gary Woods passed away on 16 March 2024 aged 80 years following a bravely fought battle with Alzheimer's. Glennys and Gary Woods ran the St. Wilfrid's Dance Class from 1990 to 2021, raising many thousands of pounds for all local charities. The class sadly only ceased because of Gary's illness. In 2020 Gary was awarded the British Empire Medal for services to charity which was around the time of the beginning of his illness. His funeral service will be at Preston Crematorium on Friday 5 April at 2.15pm. Gary requested that he not have a Requiem Mass because he wanted his body to be donated for Alzheimer's research but, unfortunately, legal processes mean this wish cannot be fulfilled.
