Journeying in Faith

In his pastoral letter this weekend, Bishop Paul reflects upon the Holy Family and on today's Gospel, the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple.

Our other readings focus on Abraham and his faith in God. Genesis tells us Abraham put his faith in God and the writer of the letter to the Hebrews develops this theme. Faith here is not a question of accepting certain propositions about God, it is a little bit different from what we do when we recite the Creed.

Here faith is about trusting God. It is with this trust that Abraham sets out from his own country to the land to which God leads him, it is with this faith that Abraham and Sarah believed God's promise in the birth of Isaac. It was with this kind of faith that Abraham was ready to offer Isaac, even though it seemed to go against the promises that God had made to him. This faith is a readiness to trust God, even when we do not see the way forward or understand where God is leading us. Often,



we face things we do not understand. It was this faith which enabled Simeon and Anna, in the Gospel, to wait patiently for the coming of the Messiah. It was a faith that was shown to be justified when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus in the Temple and Simeon and Anna recognised that here was the one for whom they had been waiting.

Today's readings call us to wait in faith, to trust in God, especially in those times when we do not see how things will work out, times when faith is difficult. This faith is a gift for which we need to ask as we go through our lives. Let us ask for this faith as we prepare to enter a new year.


